Comm. McKinney called the Meeting to order at 1:30 P.M.

**1. Consider and Take Action to approve the Minutes of previous IT Committee Meeting.**

Motion made by Michael Bynum and seconded by Sheriff Hillhouse to accept the minutes of the July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018, IT Meeting as amended, for filing purposes only. Item passes.

**2. Consider and Take Action on issues related to the Odyssey Project.**

Comm. McKinney had discussed with Josh the upcoming Criminal E-filing, passing information from department to department; there are things that won't pass from the Fire Marshall's office to the JP's offices. They are working on setting up an FTP site that they will be able to upload to, so information will go to the JP offices and they won't have to re-enter cases.

**3. Consider and Take Action on software proposal for Road and Bridge Departments.**

Motion made by Judge Pollock and seconded by Michael Bynum to approve presenting PubWorks Software proposal in the amount of \$17,000.00 for all Precincts to Commissioner's Court. Item passes.

Bob Guion, with PubWorks gave a brief presentation about the software for Road and Bridge, stating the software is specialized for city and county governments. It documents the work done every day and tracts costs, repairs of roads, vehicles, equipment and it has mobile capability as well. It also has a depreciation report for vehicles as well as for equipment etc. This software creates FEMA reports on damages to roads during flooding or bad weather events and it tracks the equipment that was used for repairs of roads as well. Data can be Cloud based for mobile use. Each Precinct can set up if they want Cloud base or on a local server or shared server.

Tina Clark discussed the cloud base that is run through a remote desk top access through the system.

Tina discussed the ESRI. The desk top map viewer runs on an Environmental Systems Research Institute (ESRI) platform, if you have ESRI data of signs, streets and guardrails, this will be able to take the data from ESRI and use it to populate the data base you are going to be using to record all the work. The map viewer itself will connect through a standard ESRI layer file to the live Geographic Information Systems (GIS) data. The mobile devises does not require ESRI license.

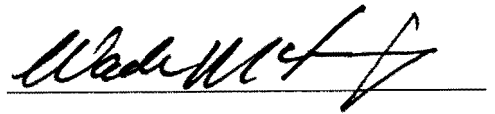
**4. Consider and Discuss IT Director Report.**
